Neebinnaukzhik means "summer evening" in Anishinaabemowin. Neebin is driven to uplift diverse Native communities through their work.

For the letter H, Neebin chose to creatively depict a hummingbird in motion using heavy linework, which is commonly used by Anishinaabe and Cree artists working in the Woodland Art style. At the center of the hummingbird is a heartline, an ancient convention seen in Anishinaabe art as well as in the art of Southwest tribal nations.
